SET 2026 Important Dates Students must complete the online application form and confirm that they meet the SET eligibility requirements in order to participate in SET 2026. The SET 2026 application will be accessible online at <https://www.set-test.org/>. SET 2026 will take place in two phases, with the first round scheduled for May 2026 from 9:00 to 10:00 a.m. Students are eligible to apply for both rounds, and admission will be determined by the higher of the two scores. 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SET Exam Pattern 2026 You have sixty minutes to attempt sixty questions. You must, of course, be quick to think! The good news is that there is no negative marking, so you can try every question without worrying about losing points. Additionally, because there are no time constraints between sections, the exam allows you to move freely between them.

The SET exam is typically regarded as having an Easy-to-Moderate difficulty level, with the exception of a few questions that could be challenging and time-consuming. The structure and pattern of the exam are clearly summarized in the table below.

There are two phases to the entire selection process:

Step 1: Show up for the SET. Seventy percent of the final selection is based on the SET exam result. Your performance on the entrance exam will be increased proportionately. For instance, your score will be scaled to show a score out of 70 if you receive 40 out of 60 points. Step 2: Candidates who have been shortlisted go through a PI (Personal Interview) and WAT (Written Ability Test) to evaluate their writing, critical thinking, and communication skills. Candidates are invited for a personal interview (PI) after passing the SET exam and meeting the overall cut-off. Thirty percent of your ultimate score comes from this round.

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SET Syllabus 2026 – Overview

Symbiosis International (Deemed University) administers the Symbiosis Entrance Test (SET General). It serves as the entry point for prospective undergraduates looking to get admitted to a variety of cutting-edge programs at various Symbiosis Institutes. These courses, which include Management, Mass Communication, Economics, Computer Studies, Information Technology, Applied Statistics and Data Science, Media Management, and Dual Degree programs, are intended for students with a wide range of academic interests.

We have examined previous papers and trends to give you a suggested list of topics to cover, even though Symbiosis does not formally prescribe a syllabus for the SET. The SET assesses your aptitude in four parts, as previously mentioned: I) General English II) General Knowledge III) Quantitative Aptitude IV) Analytical and Logical Reasoning.

The breakdown of the topics tested under each section is as follows:

SET General English Syllabus

Reading comprehension and vocabulary questions are included in this section. A table outlining some of the key subjects taught in the SET English syllabus can be seen below.

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SET Exam Syllabus 2026 for English include:

Understanding the meaning of poems, recognizing literary devices (such as personification and transferring epithets), deciphering figurative language, and examining rhyme systems are all included in poetry comprehension and analysis.

Grammar & Sentence Structure: This involves spotting mistakes in sentence structure or word choice as well as the proper usage of prepositions, tenses, conjunctions, etc. in fill-in-the-blank format.

Vocabulary: This includes questions that ask you to select the right word to complete sentences, determine the definitions of idioms and proverbs, identify compound words, countable and uncountable nouns, and recognize proper spelling.

SET General Knowledge Syllabus

The General Knowledge section's syllabus covers a wide range of subjects, from historical details to current affairs. The trend in recent years has been to concentrate more on Static GK topics with fewer questions devoted to current issues, even though the material is not set and can change. Static GK usually deals with topics that don't change much throughout time. This includes:

1. History: Important events, dates, and figures from world and Indian history.
2. Geography: Knowledge of countries, capitals, rivers, mountains, and other physical features.
3. Politics: Details about the structure of the Indian government, international relations, and key political figures.
4. Economics: Fundamental economic concepts, historical events in economic development, and national economic policies.
5. Science & Technology: Basic scientific knowledge, discoveries, and inventions.

SET Exam Syllabus 2026:

The Current Affairs component tests candidates' awareness of the ongoing developments across the globe. You should stay updated on:

1. National and International News: Key political, social, and economic events that have occurred recently.
2. Sports and Awards: Major sports events, winners of awards like the Nobel Prize, and significant sporting achievements.
3. Business and Economy: Changes in the global and Indian economy, notable corporate news, and new government policies.
4. Science and Technology: Innovations, research, and breakthroughs in various scientific fields.
5. Environment and Sustainability: News related to environmental issues, climate change, and sustainability efforts.

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SET Quantitative Aptitude Syllabus

Candidates should concentrate on particular subjects that are more likely to come up in the test questions. Algebra, percentages, number systems, and profit and loss from the quantitative ability are some of these subjects.

SET Exam Syllabus 2026: Key topics to focus on are

1. Arithmetic: Percentages, Profit & Loss, Ratio & Proportion, Time & Work, Time & Distance, Simple & Compound Interest, Averages, and Mixtures & Alligations.
2. Algebra: Linear equations, Quadratic equations, and Simplifications.
3. Geometry and Mensuration: Area, Volume, Perimeter, Angles, Triangles, Circles, and Coordinate Geometry basics.
4. Data Interpretation (DI): Graphs (Bar, Line, Pie), Tables, and Caselets.
5. Number System: Divisibility, HCF & LCM, Factors, and Remainders.
6. Modern Math: Probability, Permutations, and Combinations

SET Analytical & Logical Reasoning Syllabus

As evidenced by current trends, verbal thinking abilities assessment is given similar weight in this part. Drawing conclusions, recognizing assumptions, analyzing cause and effect, assessing syllogisms, and differentiating between strong and weak arguments are some of the common subjects covered in the questions.

SET Exam Syllabus 2026: Key Topics to Focus On

1. Verbal Reasoning: Syllogisms, Coding-Decoding, Series, Statement-Conclusion, and Statement-Assumption.
2. Non-Verbal Reasoning: Patterns, Mirror Images, Water Images, and Figure Completion.
3. Analytical Reasoning: Blood Relations, Puzzles, Seating Arrangements (Linear and Circular), and Directions.
4. Critical Reasoning: Cause & Effect, Course of Action, and Strong vs. Weak Arguments.
5. Data Sufficiency and logical puzzles.
